Dear Families,

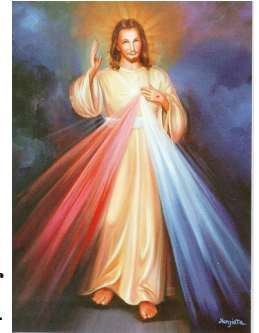
